We will attempt to polish them with a fine cleaner to reduce or eliminate the distortion problem when using a scope through them. If that doesn't work, we will have to become creative in scope mounting by developing some sort of mount to fit inside the portal and not interfere with the execution of the shot. Other than the cold trigger fingers, the climate was very comfortable. Contributions were made by Lance and Erhard for the shelves and polish. I will be passing the hat to the rest of the shooters if need be.

As to scores, given that we are in the process of developing the range around us as we shoot, they may be at variance to the norm. Even that, one cannot help but notice that there was only a one point spread between several shooters.
